

From The Vicarage

Who is church for? We can get a hint from who Jesus surrounded himself with in the Gospels. He made a beeline for the most well-mannered, respectable pillars of the community—you know the ones: tasteful jumpers, perfectly trimmed hedges, 2 children, and a Labra-doodle named Bob. Except, of course... he didn't.

He sought out fishermen who'd dropped out of school, traitorous thieving tax collectors, terrorist zealots, ladies of the night, foreigners, children, beggars, the sick, the excluded.

He gathered around him a messy, marvellous crowd. Of course, the upstanding pillars of society weren't excluded and were welcome and present too. And it's still true today. Our congregation includes people from a whole range of backgrounds, cultures, identities, and family shapes. Migrants and lifelong locals. Neurodiverse children and Neurospicy adults. Single parents, married couples, and those figuring things out. There's no such thing as the "right sort" with him.

It's easy to make snap judgements. The headlines often invite us to. But it's interesting, isn't it, how often we meet someone who supposedly belongs to "that group" and suddenly say, "Well, they're different—this one's a good one." Almost as if... if we really met each person, we'd find good ones everywhere.

Jesus meets people face-to-face. He listens. He loves. He calls each of us by name. God knows the number of hairs on every head—not because he's a trivia fan, but because he cares deeply about every single person and how we can flourish *together*.

This is the kind of church we're trying to be. Not a museum of the perfect, but a family of the forgiven. Church is a place where all are welcome, known, and loved right from day one—not despite who you are, but because of who you are.

BEAT THE SCAMMERS

The new world of AI (Artificial Intelligence) is becoming quite sophisticated. It is such an amazing tool which can help in many ways. And yes, you guessed it right, the scammers are also loving it.

We hear Martin Lewis often saying to not believe all the information out there with his picture or voice. All enabled scams have seen almost a 5-fold increase over the past year. All is even used on dating websites creating a very special relationship. And all of this with only one objective: "Get our money"

- **Tip 1:** Scammers create familiar personas to build trust with their victims. This could be a person we personally know. So, if we get a call or message from somebody, we APPEAR to know requesting help or information, stop and think. Is it really the person they appear to be.
- **Tip 2:** Al bots are also able to help scammers correspond with us in a far more convincing and personal way than previously. "Be wary of too-good-to-be-true offers"





LONG BENNINGTON WI

Tuesday 1 July – our speakers this evening were Patty and Dave Harris who entertained us with 'Flatlands' - songs and stories of their personal experience of living in the Lincolnshire Fens and exploring its heritage.



Patty explained how St Guthlac, after being a monk for many years, decided to spend the rest of his life as a hermit in his home, a simple hut sitting on high ground above the Fen marshes. There are currently plans to set up an archaeological dig to expose his hermitage.

Patty and Dave's love of their local landscape was told through songs and stories of ghosts, demons, highwaymen and historical events, such as the great flood of 1953 affecting Chapel Point to Sutton-on-Sea. Many of the locals who had been rescued by boat from their homes died of hyperthermia because of how cold the weather was at the time.

The local people had lived off eels and fish caught in the waters and marshland around the area but there was the push to reclaim land from the sea, affecting their way of life. Labourers were brought into the area from Ireland over a long period of time and, whilst the locals kept removing the earth that had been used to drain off the water, eventually the fenland was drained and the local way of life changed forever. White poppies had grown in the marshes and the opium from them was used to fight off malaria but there is also evidence that many of the women who collected the opium lived well into their 70s when the average age for women at the time was 50 to 60 years of age.

Slides showed how man-made the area of the Wash and Fenlands actually was and how the River Welland, after bursting its banks one winter, froze over allowing the locals the opportunity to skate over it.

Patty and Dave have created many songs relating to the history of Lincolnshsire Fens and, a particularly lovely song that Patty sang was 'Walk by the River with me' relating to walking on the man-made land created by land drainage.


The last slide they showed was a poster advertising a BBQ and Music event for 29 May 1967 to be held at the Tulip Bulb Auction Hall in Spalding featuring Jimmy Hendrix, The Move, Cream, Pink Floyd and Geno Washington and The Ram Jam Band – all for the admission price of £1.00.

Certainly a very entertaining and enjoyable evening enjoyed by all Members. Our WI does not have a formal meeting in August but a coach trip to Bletchley Park is taking place in August as well as a lunch at The Duck, Woolsthorpe. We shall be meeting up again at the beginning of September for a social evening of 'Dress the Mother of the Bride/Groom' - that should prove to be great fun – sewing skills not required.

Dear friends,

Have you noticed how difficult people can be to please? When the winter is on us, we complain about the cold. In the height of summer, we complain about the heat. In the autumn we're gloomy because winter is coming, and in the spring we're unhappy because we want summer to come faster. It seems like we're never satisfied.

Of course, all the time we're complaining, we are missing out on the particular satisfactions of the present moment and are robbed of a sense of fulfilment and peace. Sometimes we lose our serenity because we give up what we have now for something we hope will be more to our liking later, only to find when we get there that it isn't really any better.



Recently I was preparing for a funeral. The deceased had lived a very ordinary kind of life, in modest circumstances. She hadn't achieved the great things we are led to aspire to these days. She hadn't really seen the world. She had simply served her family, her neighbours and her church faithfully and lovingly for a very long time.

Yet her life was exceedingly rich. She didn't complain, even when her health failed. She gave a lot to others; she was dignified, gracious, and gentle. People described her as homely, courageous and serene. And they said that the world would be poorer without her. Today I came across some words by James Allen, who lived from 1864 –1912: The strong, calm person is always loved and revered. He is like a shade-giving tree in a thirsty land, or a sheltering rock in a storm.


Who we are is at least as important as what we do. What kind of person do you want to be?

The one-time UN Secretary-General, Dag Hammarskjöld longingly wrote in his journal: 'If only I may grow: firmer, simpler – quieter, warmer.' In a complex world, people who create simplicity make an impact. In a society where people fail to make commitments, a committed person is an anchor in the current of experience. In a world filled with noise and hurry, the person who is comfortable with silence and solitude provides a calm centre, and in a cold, friendless climate, the warm individual provides a welcoming space into which we can cross and find comfort.

As God's people, we are called to make a difference in the world, but the difference must come out of who we are. It must be authentic. If we want a more peaceful world, we must be more peaceable people. If we want a more just world, we have to be fairer in our dealings with others. If we want others to follow Jesus, we have to make sure that we are keeping in step with him. As Mahatma Ghandi once said, 'You must be the change you want to see.'

Perhaps we can begin by being more content and less dissatisfied, more grateful and less critical. As summer holidays give way to harvest celebrations, we are invited to come with a heart of gratitude to the God who gives all. Let's find genuine reasons to thank him this year, and make it a daily habit.
