



WHAT IS GREEN...?...

The colour green is vital to our life. It provides life. If you think of green you almost definitely think of nature, life and growth.

Despite these feelings of health and growth it is also associated with illness, perhaps thanks to the emerald city and the green faced wicked witch of the west!

Green was once a popular wedding dress colour, Queen Victoria hugely influenced the shiB to white or ivory with her choice of bridal wear in 1840.

In colour phycology green is a colour symbolising opHmism and energy.

Green sits right in the centre of the colour spectrum making it one of the easiest colours for us to see. this is one of the reasons you'll find it used on first aid boxes, emergency exit signs and on passenger instruction notices for ferries & boats.

A combinaHon of the vibrancy of yellow and the soothing calm of blue it is a colour we use, someHmes subconsciously, to keep us balanced and relaxed.

But it hasn't always been such a friendly colour!

According to colour historians, in 1775 aBer many failed aPempts to create a reliable green pigment, a Swedish scienHst succeeded. He produced Scheele's green and the pigment was used in everything from painHng children's toys to colouring fabrics.....someHmes with terrible results as it contained the toxic chemical Arsonite. It is suggested that Napoleon Bonaparte was fatally poisoned by his own bedroom wallpaper, guess what colour it was?

Green pigments of today are far less damaging to us but despite the colours associaHon with the 'green' movement we sHII use some green pigments that can be environmentally damaging. For instance, some plasHc and paper producHon use chlorine based green pigment which can, in Hme, leach out. There are definitely companies out there producing more natural pigments for paints, dyes and products, it's up to us to do a bit of research to support our own green values.

So next Hme you find yourself on a village green, feel a bit green around the gills, or you find that you're green with envy over a garden created by green fingers, maybe you'll be able to take a moment to consider the importance and influence of the colour green.



Mincemeat Crumble Slices


(All weights & measures are approximate)

Ingredients:

300g/10-11ozs Self-raising Flour 175g/6-7ozs BuDer, cubed and fridge cold 50g Light Brown Muscavado Sugar 1 tsp Mixed Spice 400g Jar of Mincemeat

Method:

Preheat the oven to 180°c (160°fan) and line a 20 x 30cm/7-8inches x 11-12inches baking Sn with baking paper.



Press half the mixture into the base of the Sn and then spread the jar of mincemeat over the top. Sprinkle the rest of the crumble mixture on top and lightly press down.

Bake for 30-35 minutes. Leave to cool in the Sn before cuY ng into squares.

Jane's Virtuous and Easy fat free mincemeat

Make your own mincemeat using windfall apples or those reaching the end of their storage time

As with all my recipes, this is rough and ready, no exact quantities - use what you've got!

Put all the following into a really large casserole that will fit in your oven

2 or 3 lbs apple - any sort, peeled, cored, chopped roughly

2 -3 lbs dried fruit of any sort, e.g. sultanas

Some candied peel can be added to this if wished - I do

4 oz dark Muscovado sugar or dark brown soft suar

1 litre orange juice or apple juice

4 or 5 heaped teaspoons spices of your choice e.g. ginger, cloves, nutmeg, allspice (even cinnamon if you must!)

Method

Mix it all together in your big pot.

Put a lid on and put it in the oven for a couple of hours or so around 180°C Store in airtight jars.

Makes the kitchen smell lovely!

That's it - no fuss but tastes deliclous





Kathleen's Kitchen

Ideas for using leftovers from Christmas Day

Leftover Vegetable Traybake - serves 2-4

(All weights & measures are approximate)

600g/1lb 5ozs of ready cooked roast vegetables 1tbsp olive oil to drizzle Black pepper Any mixture of herbs that you would like 3tbsp of leftover cranberry sauce 150a/5-6ozs Brie – sliced



Method

Heat the oven to 200c/180c fan Put the roast veg in a roasting tin, drizzle with the oil, add black pepper & scatter over the herbs.

Roastfor 15 mins to heat through & crisp up.

Dot the Brie over the roasted veg & return to the oven for 5-8mins, until melted.

Drizzle with the cranberry sauce add anything else you fancy to garnish.

Note: Instead of the Brie & cranberry sauce, if wished, make a cheese sauce & pour over & put back in the oven & bake for 10mins or so.

Christmas Pudding Trifle.

(All weights & measures are approximate)

Ingredients:

3 oranges

1 tbsp Demerara sugar

2 tbsp Grand Marnier or any liqueur you fancy or use orange juice if you do not want alcohol 300g/10-11ozs leftover Christmas pudding

500g/17-18ozs mascarpone

250g/8-9ozs pot of custard 284ml/half of a pint of double cream

To serve:

Handful flaked almonds, toasted Chocolate (whichever you prefer), grated

Peel the oranges using a sharp knife, ensuring all the pith is removed. Slice as thinly as possible and arrange over a dinner plate. Sprinkle with the Demerara sugarfollowed by the Grand Marnier or orange juice and set aside.

Crumble the Christmas pudding into large pieces and scatter over the bottom of a trifle bowl. Lift the oranges onto the pudding in a layer and pour over any juices.

Beat the mascarpone until smooth and then stir in the custard. Spoon the mixture over the top of the oranges.

Lightly whip the cream and spoon over the custard. Sprinkle with the flaked almonds and grated chocolate. You can make this a day in advance if you like, chill until ready to serve.



Tattershall Castle

Last month's article was about Lincolnshire Day and its date of October 1st, which commemorates the anniversary of Lincoln Rising in 1536, a revolt against the establishment of the Church of England by Henry VIII.

The riots were quelled by the threat of an army led by Charles Brandon, Duke of Suffolk. He was Henry VIII's best friend and his wife Catherine Willoughby's family owned vast areas of Lincolnshire. As a reward for for putting down the rebellion Charles Brandon was gifted Tattershall Castle.



You may have passed this impressive Medieval tower on your way to the coast.

The first recorded building on the site was a manor house, built around 1231 by Robert de Tateshale. This was hugely expanded and rebuilt in brick, between 1430 and 1450, by Lord Ralph Cromwell, Treasurer of England. Around 900,000 bricks were used to built the castle. Today the 130ft high (40m) Great Tower and moat still exist, the tower containing three huge state rooms.

Lord Cromwell set about making it much grander to match his status. With over 100 servants he needed the space and it must have impressed visitors.

After Cromwell's death in 1456 the Castle passed to the Crown, until it was gifted to Charles Brandon. Following Brandon's death it belonged to the Earls of Lincoln. In 1643 during the Civil War, a large part of the Castle was damaged. After the King's defeat the Castle was to due be demolished but the Great Tower was spared.

Following the death of the Earl of Lincoln in 1693, the Castle passed to the Fortesque family. The Castle was abandoned, the floors collapsed

and the moats were filled in.

In 1910 Lord Curzon of Keddleston purchased the Castle to prevent it being sold to an American group. He undertook restoration between 1911 and 1914 and on his death in 1925 the Castle was gifted to the National Trust and has been open to visitors ever since.

Tattershall Castle remains one of the three most important surviving brick castles of the 15th century in England.




Next to the castle is the 15th Century Collegiate Church of Holy Trinity. It's status was significant. It is flooded with light from enormous windows. By the font is a memorial plaque to Tom Thumb (died 1620) reputedly only 18 ins (47 cms) tall who lived to be 101.



It is a beautiful church and well worth a visit.

A mile away is the church of St Michael in Coningsby. On the 15th century tower is a unique, one handed clock, painted direct onto the stonework. The clock face is 16.5 feet in diameter and the hand is 9 feet long.

If you are in the area and interested in aircraft, visit the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight at Coningsby. It is the home of the still flying RAF Lancaster and a number of Spitfires and other aircraft
