Christmas is a holiday well loved by many across the world - however fun it may be, there can be negative effects for the environment due to our celebrations. Unfortunately, around 2.3 million pounds of wrapping paper ends up in landfill annually. But it doesn't have to be this way! There are actually lots of different kinds of wrapping paper which can end up being recycled!

Matte wrapping paper can be recycled, same as any wrapping paper that doesn't have a glitter or glossy coating. However, it is important to note that any additions to the wrapping paper, such as bows and sticky tape can end up making it unrecyclable! Remember to remove these, don't forget to remove the tags too! The recyclable wrapping paper can then go into your recycling bin at home. If you are unsure whether or not your wrapping paper qualifies, you can always do the scrunch test! But what is the scrunch test? Wrapping paper that can be scrunched up into a ball and remain in that ball can be recycled.

Did you know that not all wrapping paper is made up completely by paper? Some can even be plastic based! So, what kind of wrapping paper can you not recycle? You can't recycle wrapping paper which contains foil and non-paper additives, or any wrapping paper which is laminated, plastic-coated or even metallic!

Making small switches like buying wrapping paper which has been previously recycled is always a good decision, especially when the environment is involved! It is likely that previously recycled wrapping paper can be recycled again!

Now that we are in the season of giving - give the world a chance to heal itself by reducing waste! Happy holidays!


We screen a minimum of 1 film per month, with a range of genres. We're happy to take requests if there's a film you missed at the cinema and want to see on a big screen.





FARMYARD TAILS

Even though Autumn was relatively dry the ground around our farm remained wet in places and as such it was time to bring the Cattle indoors.

They come into two barns and are separated into various groups for handling and welfare reasons.

~Cows with their calves 'at foot'- these are late born calves that will stay with their Dams until turnout next spring.

~Cows whose calves need to be taken away so the cow can rest in preparation for next springs calving.

~Heifers, young females under 3yrs of age.

~Steers, castrated males.

~Retired cows, these are cows that for one reason or another I have decided not to put to the Bull. These will live out the rest of their lives on the farm just eating grass.

We wean the calves in late Autumn when we bring all the cattle in as it is easier logistically to separate them all out. The calves go into a separate barn and are fed a premium quality hay to ensure they continue to grow well whilst they are indoors.

The Steers will be sold to a finishing unit in Yorkshire but we keep a couple back each year to rear on ourselves.

The Heifers will stay with us for a while. We halter train them to calm them down as they can be a tad spirited. We will then either sell them to other breeders or keep them ourselves as replacements for the older cows we've retired.

Our bull Ragnor has been moved to his winter quarters. He weighs in excess of 800kg and as such it is important he rests indoors whilst the ground is so soft. This protects him from muscle strains and hoof problems. He has a lovely deep straw bed and can still see his ladies over the yard.

Kathleen's Kitchen

Creamy Vegetable Bake (use up your leftovers!)

(All weights & measures are approximate) (For approximately 4 servings)

Ingredients:

Any assortment of chopped cooked vegetables & meat (if wanted), uncooked vegetables can be used if desired, but need to be cooked Approximately 2lb/1kg

White Sauce (if you would prefer - you can use any white sauce of your choice)

2 tbsp of oil (any that you prefer or butter or mix of butter & oil)
1 tbsp finely chopped garlic
2 tbsp flour
Milk 3/4 - 1 pint/455ml
A quarter tsp nutmeg (optional)
1 tsp thyme
Salt & black pepper to taste.



Alternatively, you can make it into a cheese sauce.

Method:

Heat oil in a saucepan, add garlic & cook for 10-20 seconds. Add flour & cook over a low heat for 1-2 mins, then gradually add the

milk, stirring a II the time to avoid lumps. Keep stirring until the sauce thickens.

Once the sauce thickens, a dd the various seasonings, spices & herbs.

Heat the oven to 180°c & grease a large casserole dish & arrange vegetables (& chopped meat if wanted), then stir the sauce into the veg, making sure that the veg is well covered. Bake for 15- 20 mins until golden.

Note: The Bake can be topped with cheese if wanted &/or topped with mashed potato & put back in the oven to brown.

Beans, Peas and Christmas

The Twelve Days of Christmas is the period between the birth of Christ and the arrival of the Three Wise Men.

Christmas cards, decorations and gifts start to appear in the shops in September (it seems to get a little earlier every year) but in many religions Christmas actually starts on Christmas Day and lasts for Twelve Days until January 5th.

There are lots of traditions around Christmas, dependant on religion, geography and culture.

Christmas trees were introduced into the UK by Queen Charlotte, consort of George III and were first seen at Windsor in December 1800. They were further popularised by Prince Albert, husband of Queen Victoria.

In the Middle Ages (5th to 15th centuries) Christmas was a period of continuous feasting and merrymaking which climaxed on Twelfth Night.

A special Twelfth Night cake was baked which contained a bean and a pea. Called a King Cake, "a man who finds the bean within his slice of cake is King for the night, whilst a lady who finds a pea in her slice of cake shall become the Queen." Following



this, parties would continue and include the singing of Christmas carols as well as feasting. Modern King Cakes often contain a small plastic baby doll as well as a pea!

The Theatre Royal, Drury Lane in London has had a tradition since 1795 of providing a Twelfth Night cake to the company in residence on 6th January. This resulted from a bequest in a will of Robert Badderley of £100 to provide cake and punch every year.

In Ireland it is still traditional to place the statues of the Three Kings in the crib on Twelfth Night.

Thus around the world the Twelve Days of Christmas are celebrated in many ways both religious and secular.

Christmas Day is celebrated as the Nativity of the Lord and is a public holiday in many nations including many non christian countries.

December 26th is St Stephen's Day in the western churches and is also known as Boxing Day in the UK and its former colonies.

Several years ago my friend Mary Holland introduced me to to a very funny film **Dinner for One**. It was produced by German TV in 1963 but was only shown for the first time in the Uk in 2018. Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Germany, Austria,

Finland and Switzerland TV broadcast the film every New Years Eve and it seems to be compulsive viewing. Everyone thinks it is hilarious. It stars only two actors; Freddy Frinton and May Warden and has very little dialogue. Freddy was born in Grimsby so there is a Lincolnshire connection. It can be found on Youtube etc.



Wreaths were traditionally hung on a door for the twelve days. They contained fruits and other edibles, taken down on Twelfth Night and the items eaten.

Monks didn't have to fast on Saints days and each of the twelve days is a saints day so celebrating the period involved much eating and drinking.

Some Christians give a gift on each of the twelve days to represent a wish for each of the calendar months in the coming year. Some light a candle on each day and sing a verse of the tradition Twelve Days of Christmas song. Some give gifts on the first and last days of Christmas.







