# Kathleen's Kitchen Bacon & Peas Risotto

All measures are approximate - serves 4

### Ingredients:


1 onion

2 tbsp olive oil

Knob of butter

6 rashers streaky bacon chopped

(smoked optional)



1ltr/almost 2 pints of hot chicken or vegetable stock

100g/ 3.5- 4oz frozen peas

Salt & pepper (I use black for depth of flavour & not white for a fiery heat) Freshly grated parmesan to serve (optional)

### Method:

- Finely chop 1 onion. Heat 2 tbsp olive oil and a knob of butter in a pan, add the onions and fry until lightly browned (about 7 minutes).
- 2. Add 6 chopped rashers streaky <u>bacon</u> and fry for a further 5 minutes, until it starts to crisp.
- Add risotto rice and 1ltr/almost 2 pints hot stock, bring to the boil. Stir well and then reduce the heat to low and cook covered, for 15-20 minutes until the rice is almost tender.
- 4. Stir in frozen peas, add a little salt and pepper and cook for a further 3 minutes, until the peas are cooked.
- 5. Serve sprinkled with freshly grated parmesan and freshly ground black pepper.

# CLAYPOLE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN GET READY TO VOTE

The Claypole Neighbourhood Plan is completed and will guide all future planning decisions in the village if it is supported by residents in a referendum to be held on **5 October 2023.** 

The Plan has been developed by a Steering Group, at the request of the Parish Council, and funded by grants. It builds on the responses residents gave to the survey carried out in March 2021, and the responses to the Consultations last year and earlier this year. Since the Steering Group submitted the Plan to South Kesteven District Council it has undergone a statutory revue and has been strengthened by the comments of an independent examiner. Now we will all be given the opportunity to vote on whether to accept the Plan in a referendum to be conducted by South Kesteven District Council.

The Plan is a lengthy and technical document which will be posted on the District Council web site. It covers many aspects of planning, from house building to design, but importantly the Plan seeks to:

- Protect Claypole's status and character as a village
- Protect our community green spaces
- Ensure that Claypole remains a vibrant place to live and visit
- Ensure we have the homes we need for the future, while
- Ensuring no new mass housing developments are forced on the village

If these issues matter to you then it is important that you vote to accept the Plan – just 5 minutes of your time on 5 October.

We expect that details of how to you can see the Plan and how you can vote will be sent to each household by the District Council in September. Meantime, if you have any questions to ask about the Plan, we'll do our best to answer them - Email claypolenp2021@yahoo.com

## Bishop Grosseteste

There are two universities in Lincoln - The University of Lincoln and the Bishop Grosseteste University (BGU). BGU was established as a teacher training college for the Diocese of Lincoln in 1862 and is now a well respected university with about 2,300 students on a variety of courses.

Robert Grosseteste, also known as Robert Greathead or Robert of Lincoln, was an English statesman, scholastic philosopher, theologian, scientist and Bishop of Lincoln. He was born of humble parents in Stradbroke, Suffolk 1175 and died October 9th 1253 in Buckden, Buckinghamshire.

Historians sometimes refer to this time in history as the Dark Ages. Whilst great advances in science, arts and culture were happening around the globe, it was thought little or no development was happening in the UK. Bishop G's work shows that may not be the case.

He studied at Oxford where he became proficient at Law, Medicine and

Natural Sciences before studying Theology. After teaching theology in Paris he returned to teach at GreyFriars, Oxford. He was appointed chancellor of Oxford University 1215 to 1221.

By 1214 at the age of 39 he held the Archdeaconry of Chester and subsequently Northampton and Leicester. In 1235 he was elected the Bishop of Lincoln, a post he held until his death at the age of 78.

At that time Lincoln was the most populous Diocese in England. He set about reforming the morals and clerical discipline in the Diocese and this brought him into conflict with many of the clergy. Ultimately the Pope settled disputes in the Bishop's favour in 1245.

A group of academics - a medieval historian, an experimental psychologist, and a theoretical physicist have been working together for over 12 years on the

series of treatises written in the first third of the 13th century by Robert Grosseteste. Their research shows he penned an extraordinary series of natural philosophical works on astronomy, the properties of matter, light,



sound, colour, comets, atmospheric phenomena and optics.

From 1229 or 1230 to 1235 he was first lecturer in theology to the Franciscans, on whom his influence was profound. Surprisingly, he was also the first author to include an index in a book. Going forward 800 years and having an index is the core operation of Google and enables internet searches.

Grosseteste means Big Head perhaps he needed it to contain his massive brain. He thought about concepts that weren't confirmed until centuries later. The concept of multiverses and the basis of modern science experiments have been attributed to Bishop G. His idea was that a scientist (but they were not called that in the 12th century) after some thought developed a theory and then constructed an experiment to prove or disprove the theory. Further experiments built on earlier ones and conducted by other scientists were necessary before a proof of theory was accepted.



On his death he was revered as a saint in England, but attempts to secure formal canonisation failed. However, he was beatified and his feast day is commemorated on the 9th October.
