





Introducing our new young reporter Elizabeth

Now it's February, it's time to use the new purple lidded recycling bin! This new bin's function is to recycle cardboard, paper, newspapers, junk mail and any household or food packaging. It is recommended by the council that the tape on cardboard boxes is removed as much as possible, but it will not be an issue if there are little bits still attached when the box is thrown into the bin.

The most common type of packaging tape is polypropylene - which turns out to be amongst the most common plastic materials. Therefore, the size and the thickness makes it impossible to be separated and processed as tape.

However, even though it cannot be put into the new purple bins, polypropylene is not without its advantages to the environment. In fact, even though it is not completely sustainable, it is an environmentally conscious option! It has a relatively low carbon footprint and doesn't release toxins.

All this recycling is good news for the environment! The clean, dry and quality cardboard will be sent directly to a paper mill, described as dedicated by the council, known as Palm Paper Limited.

Palm uses recycled raw materials to manufacture paper! They even go as far as operating the world's largest paper machine for newsprint in the United Kingdom. They even say themselves how important sustainable paper production is to them and how they are oriented towards being environmentally friendly.

If everyone in the country recycled just 10% more paper it would be enough to save approximately five million trees each year!

Wednesday 10th April, this month we are at Westborough Village Hall, there will be tea/coffee and cake for those who attend. Please come along and join us.



Kathleen's Kitchen

This is a quick & simple recipe using 4 - 6 ingredients, for 4 people, but can be adjusted either way!

All measures are approximate.

Fish Fillets with Orange Sauce (If preferred, use fresh lemon)

Ingredients:

4 fresh white fish fillets

1 fresh orange

2tbs of white wine (optional).

If not using wine, replace with more orange juice

3 tbs of butter melted

Method

Zest the orange & then juice it.

Place 1tbsp butter in a frying pan & heat.

Place the fish in the pan.

Blend 2tbsp orange juice & wine with the rest of the melted butter & pour half of it over the fish.

Sprinkle with sea salt, black pepper & 2 tbsp of zest.

Cook for 2 minutes before pouring the rest of the sauce over the fish.

Continue cooking until the fish is done. (The fish should flake easily with a fork).

Note: Add more zest & juice if you require it & serve with any vegetables you choose.

Westborough and Dry Doddington Parish Council News

Flooding in Westborough

Storm Babet on 20 October caused the River Witham banks to burst, flooding 6 properties and cutting off normal access to 25 other dwellings. No flood alert was given to vulnerable residents and only a general alert on 18 October. The river level hit the footbridge near the church that then acted as dam, deflecting water into the village. The Parish Council agreed to a) form a working group to see what we achieve locally, b) contact LCC regarding raising or modifying the footbridge, c) lobby the Environment Agency for improved channel clearance of the river.

The Parish Council has provided 200 sand bags and 5 tonnes of sand for future use, kindly stored by John Kerr in his Westborough barn.


