

#### **VIEW FROM THE PEW - St Swithun's Long Bennington**



A belated Happy New Year to all. We try not to look back in these monthly articles, but the PCC must thank all those who donated so generously at the Military Wives Concert and to Santa's Sleigh tour of the village.

The latter raised almost £2,300, with Rotary and Church Charities and the village Pre-School being the main beneficiaries.

Now some good news, an advert for clergy to fill the vacant Loveden West post was published on 9 January, and if applicants are forthcoming interviews will be held in late March.

News allied to the East Chancel Wall repair is not so encouraging I am afraid, the PCC has spent the last 3 months battling against a Rolls Royce, expensive, repair pathway being mandated by the structural engineer to meet his, Historic England's and the DAC's requirements. We are now being forced into another year of monitoring movement in the wall before a repair plan can be agreed. All-in-all very frustrating, particularly the lack of urgency being displayed by all the agencies involved, apart from ourselves.

Easter will soon be upon us and a full list of services will be in next month's magazine. However, there will be a Holy Communion in the Church on Ash Wednesday, 14<sup>th</sup> February, probably a mid-day (please see the church noticeboard for the details).

#### **Churchyard Maintenance Volunteers**

Financial contributions (monthly or annually) towards cost of a gardener. The church spends £3500 each year on churchyard maintenance and apart from a grant of £1000 from the parish council, this must be financed from local donations.




# LONG BENNINGTON GARDENING CLUB (VPA) SPRING SHOW Saturday 23 March 2024 in St. James's Village Hall

#### LONG BENNINGTON PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

The Parish Council had its last meeting on 8<sup>th</sup> January at St James's Hall.

FINANCE – Parish Councillors approved payment of invoices totalling £6612.20 Payments approved included £1884.00 for the purchase of a replacement defibrillator for the Village Hall. The cabinet for the current one is letting in water so could compromise the availability of a working AED. It was decided, due to the age of the existing equipment to replace both AED and cabinet. The new one is to be secured on the wall by the end of January. A security light is also to be put up above the cabinet to assist access to the AED in the dark.

In December Councillors resolved to increase the precept, for 2024/25, by £1050 to £54000. This represents a 1.3% increase for a Band D household and an application to SKDC has been submitted.

PLAYING FIELD MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE – The Playing Field Management Committee has been offered and accepted a generous cash donation from Geoff Fearn. It is anticipated (but not a condition of the donation) that the PFMC will use the gift to assist with planned improvements to the Pavilion, one of the village's biggest community assets, helping to protect its longevity. The donation is for £30,000 and with the anticipated benefit of gift aid, will total £37,500.

**FLOOD PREVENTION** – SKDC have offered parishes the opportunity to hold and maintain a stock of sand and sandbags. This offer has been accepted with a tonne of sand and 100 sandbags having been delivered to Gablestock, Valley Lane, Long Bennington. The sandbags are available (currently unfilled) for collection, during normal business hours, should further incidents of flooding threaten. It is the intention to arrange for a group of volunteers to fill the sandbags. Please note, if further help is required during a flood incident, contact Lincolnshire CC, lead local flood authority on 01522 782082. SKDC have also advised that where supplies allow, where there is a serious risk of internal flooding, sandbags may be provided on a priority basis by calling 01476 406080 or 01476 406040 (out of hours). All requests for sandbags will be triaged by the on-call team.

**VILLAGE MAINTENANCE** – invitations to tender for the village grass cutting/verge maintenance contract have been sent out and will be discussed at the February Parish Council meeting.

**PLANNING** – Councillors referred to planning application S23/1616 for the change of use of land at Valley Lane for 13 traveller pitches. SKDC has advised that the Parish Council will not be consulted given the outstanding enforcement notice, and the previous planning history for the site. SKDC are seeking to decline to determine the application given that the suitability of the site has been extensively assessed as part of the previous enforcement appeal.

**LITTER PICKING** – a big thank you to our Community Cleaner, John Dodwell who continues to help keep our village tidy. Thanks also, to a number of residents who also do a fantastic job helping to keep the verges clean. More recently we have become aware of a volunteer litter picker, Dave Green, who has recently removed a significant amount of litter from our slip roads. For information, the Parish Council has some equipment if anyone wants to get involved.

**OUTSTANDING PROJECTS** – the proposed car park at the Pavilion is still being considered and the proposed gateways at four locations in the village is also still in hand, the specification having to be revised due to restrictions from the grant provider. The Playing Field Management Committee are in the early stages of looking at the possibility of replacing some of the children's play equipment at the playing field.

#### LONG BENNINGTON METHODIST CHAPEL

Dear Friends, A friend of mine was recently commenting on the week's Psalm which he was planning to use in a service he was taking at Church. The psalm itself is a great celebration of how God knows us and is everywhere we go – even the furthest and darkest corners of this world. I've always found its words comforting and encouraging – though another friend said it was a little intimidating to be known in such warts and all detail! But the controversial element in the Psalm is that towards the end, the writer asks God to destroy his enemies! For many modern ears this idea gives us pause to stop and reconsider how we use these ancient songs.

Perhaps it makes us uncomfortable to think that we have enemies. Perhaps we want so much to be peace-loving that we don't want to look at the fact that people do make life hard for us and oppose what we would like to achieve or do, and we might just harbour negative feelings towards them in the deepest recesses of our hearts. The Psalms are said to express all the possible emotions of human experience, and their words can reveal things to us that we don't always want to know about ourselves.

But they were written in perilous times, when an "enemy" might ride over the hill and attack you and your family or steal your crops or set fire to your fields or enslave you. The starkness of life and death was much more to the forefront of people's minds and found expression in their prayers to God.

When we observe the current conflicts in our world, whether between Russia and Ukraine or Israel and Palestine, it is easy to say that people ought to play nice and make peace. We may miss the fierce defensive reflex that a mortal enemy may evoke by their actions. We may miss the subtle layers of history between warring people groups that make such conflict almost inevitable and almost impossible to solve. We may miss the fact that the Psalms are more realistic about what life is like than we often are willing to admit.

We might also miss the point that peace is not the cessation of hostility, but the establishment of just and equitable relations between people. Real peace is found in the setting of a new balance between competing demands and expectations, in releasing hatred and offering forgiveness, in not seeking vengeance but instead seeking the well-being of all. If our prayers for peace, if our longings for peace, are about any less than this, we are wanting no more than a ceasefire, a pause, not a solution.

In the end, we need a fresh commitment to making peace which is even stronger than the commitment we seem to have to making war. It is this strong peace that we find in the words of the angels to the Shepherds that echoed round the world a few short weeks ago, the peace that God wills for all. Let's seek peace and pursue it.

#### LONG BENNINGTON LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

It began following a Public Meeting in the Village Hall in February 1992. At its peak the Society had over 70 members. But after the pandemic, attendances at meetings began to decline. In summer 2022 all members of the committee met together and agreed that they had run out of steam so if it was going to continue beyond 2023 the Society should have new leadership. Unfortunately, but perhaps unsurprisingly, a new committee did not emerge. So, sadly, the meeting in November 2023 was our last.

During the 30 years of its existence the Society held more than 200 talks on local history.

We published a booklet about the History of Long Bennington written by local historian Brian Widdowson. In 2013 the Society donated 250 copies to the Long Bennington Church of England Academy so every child in the village could have one to refer to at home.

We also made a sizeable donation towards the cost of the Heritage Trail from our limited funds with a view to encouraging interest in our village's rich history in the wider community.

Over the years we received many donations of old photographs, maps, documents and stories. These were recorded on our website, distributed to appropriate local organisations or deposited in Lincolnshire Archives to be kept safe in perpetuity for future students to study.

Our ageing but fully functioning projector is now a community asset, available for use by any local organisation. And we donated all our remaining funds to 4 local charities, groups and organisations.

Our website at www.lblhs.org.uk contains many interesting photographs, articles and information about our historic village. It will remain as a permanent tribute to Long Bennington Local History Society.
