From the Vicarage

We live in a world that seems to lurch from one crisis to another. One day, markets crash; the next, they soar. Trade deals falter, inflation bites, and through it all, the richest often seem to get richer.

Meanwhile, ordinary people carry the weight of uncertainty, rising costs, and decisions made far from their everyday lives.



It's tempting to think this is just the way the world works: the powerful stay powerful, and the rest of us hope not to slip. But Holy Week, still fresh in our memories, tells a different story.

Palm Sunday begins with cheering crowds and the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. By Friday, the cheers have turned to shouts, "Crucify him." It is a staggering fall—from messianic hope to public humiliation, from royal welcome to torturous death. And yet, it is precisely in that apparent collapse that something world-changing happens. There, at his lowest point, Christ lifts up the least: a common thief is ushered into paradise.

The cross is not just a symbol of suffering—it's an inversion of power itself. Where the world rewards elites who posture towards strength, Jesus shows true strength in love. In God's Kingdom, the last are first, the poor are blessed, and the meek inherit the earth.

This is not just comforting—it is reorienting. If you've ever felt passed over, let down, or left out, Jesus's Easter message is that you are not forgotten. You are, in fact, invited into the heart of God's redeeming work.

May we follow Jesus not just in the hosannas of Palm Sunday but through the shadows of Good Friday, so we can stand in the light of Easter morning—not with illusions of worldly success, but with the deep joy that comes from knowing God lifts up the lowly.



Our speaker in April was Dorothy Gaughan, who is the Grantham Foodbank Co-ordinator. Appointed in July 2023, she thoroughly enjoys her job, helping people to survive. There are approximately 40 volunteers, working in 4 teams. Anybody can be a volunteer, so if you're interested in being one of the 40,000 who help countrywide, then just go to your nearest Foodbank and offer your help!



Every day people in the UK go hungry for reasons ranging from redundancy to receiving an unexpected bill on a low income. A simple box of food makes a big difference, with foodbanks helping prevent crime, housing loss, family breakdown and mental health problems. The amount of food being distributed in a year is on the increase – as much as 73 tonnes of food in one year.

The Foodbank works using a voucher referral system. They partner with a wide range of care professionals such as doctors, health visitors, social workers and police to identify people in crisis and issue them with a voucher. This can then be presented to a foodbank, where it can be redeemed for 3 days' emergency food, along with a warm welcome, friendly advice and a warm drink. Clients can receive a voucher once every fortnight. Volunteers in the Admin team check the clients' details to ensure all the paperwork is recorded accurately.

Donated food is checked to see that it is in date, sorted and packed into boxes ready to be distributed. Food is donated by businesses, schools, churches and individuals. Pasta, rice, cereal, biscuits, baked beans, tins of fruit, rice pudding, curry and mince are always welcome, fresh vegetables like potatoes, carrots, parsnips are also donated, as is dog and cat food, pets being very important to some Foodbank clients.

Donations can be taken to Grantham Foodbank – 9.00 am – 11.00 am – Monday to Friday.



BEAT THE SCAMMERS

The good news is that we are no longer alone in "Beating the scammers". Action Fraud are now actively working on reducing this kind of crime. And we can help them by telling them when we are being targeted. Over 32 million suspicious emails have been reported to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS). These reports, by people like us, have led to more than 329,000 websites addresses being removed by the National Cyber Security Centre.

Action 1: Received an email that doesn't feel right? STOP and THINK! Report suspicious emails by forwarding them to: report@phishing.gov.uk. Send emails to this address, even if we are not certain they're a scam – they will be checked.

Action 2: Always forward suspicious text messages or scam call numbers, free of charge, to 7726. Your provider can find out where the text came from and block or ban the sender.

To report a scam text, forward it to 7726 and then send the sender's number when prompted.

To report a scam call, simply text 7726 with the word 'Call' followed by the scam caller's number.

Action 3: If you've lost money or provided financial information as a result of a phishing scam, notify your bank immediately using the telephone number on the back of your card. Also report it to Action Fraud at <u>actionfraud.police.uk</u> or by calling 0300 123 2040

Several of our members attended Shrek the Musical at the Newark Palace Theatre, having seen their performance of Evita last year, knew it would be excellent and in fact it was amazing. Every character was well drawn, not just the principals but every nursery rhyme and fairy story characters. The mechanical dragon and sets seemed real. Little Lord Farquaad had them all giggling (and they're still giggling), he didn't feel evil at all! It was an evening that lifted everyone's spirits.





On 18th March, several of our members attended a display of "The Red Dress" project, at Harrogate. Conceived by British artist, Kirstie Macleod, it provided an artistic platform for particularly women, and communities around the world, many of whom are vulnerable or live in poverty, to tell their stories through embroidery. From 2009 to 2023, pieces of The Red Dress and later the completed garment, travelled the globe. Constructed out of 87 panels of burgundy silk dupion, the dress has been embroidered on by 367 women/girls, 11 men/boys and 2 non-binary artists from 51 countries, earning a place in the Guiness World Records 2025 for the largest embroidery. This beautiful object highlights the common ground between individuals.





Our April Speaker was Rob Brunswick, from the "Lincolnshire Emergency Blood Bikes Service". He explained in detail how they all travel all over Lincolnshire, transporting donor breast milk, blood, organs, medication, and medical equipment between hospitals and healthcare facilities, for those who need them urgently! There are 156 Riders, 22 Controllers and 8 Supporters, all of whom are volunteers! They also attend Fundraising Events to obtain donations, as it costs in the region of £50,000 per year.



LONG BENNINGTON NEWS FROM THE PEWS

The Spring sunshine finally arrived last month along with the blossom, primroses, wood anemones and other wildflowers in the St Swithun's churchyard. The sun also shone for our Mothering Sunday event in the Village Hall that celebrated mothers with brilliant pictures which the children of Long Bennington Church of England Academy had produced of their mums. It was wonderful for church members to welcome Mums along with their children to enjoy the exhibition of pictures along with coffee and pastries, and a thank-you posy of daffodils.



The children from school also came to the church on the last day of term along with parents and carers. Their service was themed around the hope of Easter and they had produced some amazing posters at school as shown in the photo.

By the time you read this, we will have held a further children's event in St Swithun's church - part of the West Loveden Kids activities - on Easter Saturday. Later on, in June, our Father's Day event will be held in the village hall - more details in next month's magazine!







As we described in last month's magazine, our Grade 1 Listed Church Building has, during the last 25 years, suffered from significant movement in the North Aisle and East Chancel Walls, largely due to the breakdown of the drainage around these areas. This resulted in significant cracks in the wall and part of the main stained-glass window falling out. The underlying problem was successfully dealt with in 2019, funded by grant providers plus significant money from our church funds, donations and fund raising. So now we can go ahead with the required repair work.

The total cost of the required repair project is likely to be around £50,000. The PCC has applied to 3 Grant Providers for help with funding, and these applications are all in progress, but all require applicants to meet part of the cost themselves and we will need to raise £25,000 ourselves.

Fund raising has started well, and this year, we have already raised money through a sponsored cycle ride and Co-op Community Champions collection, for which we are very grateful. Progress towards our fund-raising goal will be reported in the magazine and using a barometer positioned outside the church gate.



Plans are also proceeding for a major Summer Fundraising event on 12 & 13th July at the church (see 'Save the Dates' poster in this magazine). To make it a success, we are asking for help, including:



Dear Friends,

Impending deadlines reinforce the message that time is in short supply. It is true in the world of work, when there are things to be completed for specific times; and in our personal lives — with the recurring planning for birthdays, anniversaries, holidays and major festivals — some of which is also reflected in our patterns of worship, reflection and celebration in church; and deadlines also come to the front of our minds when we are diagnosed with a serious illness or we know that



we have to have surgery to repair our bodies at a certain time. And there are those other markers of time when we move house or pass from one stage of life to another, when dates are fixed and preparations have to be made.

For my wife and I the latter is very much in mind, as we prepare to move house at the beginning of June and I prepare to retire from fulltime work on 31 August. There is a lot to be done in a relatively short space of time, and it takes a great deal of self-control not to panic. You will have your own memories of such things — or perhaps you are also preparing for a significant life change yourself.

This month, still in the season of Easter, the church focuses on the work of Jesus preparing his disciples for the time when he will no longer be physically with them – the time when he will be with them in spirit – or rather in the Spirit. He had much to explain in less than six weeks, and you might wonder, given their track record, how much they would be able to take in and understand. Fortunately, he pointed out that when the Spirit came at Pentecost he would continue to teach them and inspire them and to guide them in their progress as the continuing representatives of Jesus on earth.

Like all changes that happen, they could not work every detail out in advance. Nor can we. Our plans do not go "according to plan" often enough for us to know that we need much more to be expect the unexpected than to have all the details nailed down in advance. Like them, we have the wisdom, presence and encouragement of God simply to move forward and "make the way by walking". As we go we will encounter challenges and delights on our path, and both may be the will of God for that particular moment and place, if we have the courage to embrace them and see what happens.

So, wherever you are on your life's path, keep moving forward with hope and anticipation. The Spirit of Jesus leads us on.
