



From the vicarage...

Eighty years ago, on 11 November 1945, the world marked its first Armistice Day after the end of the Second World War. The guns had finally fallen silent, yet across Europe and beyond, the scars of conflict were everywhere — in cities reduced to rubble, in families grieving their dead, and in hearts weary of hatred and loss. It was a moment of fragile hope: could humanity learn a new way to live together after such devastation?

The prophet Isaiah, writing more than 2,500 years earlier, imagined a world transformed by peace: "They shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning



That same challenge faces us today. In recent weeks, the Gaza peace agreement has offered a glimmer of hope after so much suffering and bitterness. We hope and pray for all other wars to be brought to their speedy and lasting conclusion. Peace, if it is to last, cannot be simply the absence of war. It must grow in hearts willing to see former enemies as neighbours, and to rebuild what has been broken — homes, communities, and trust.

As we pause this month to remember those who gave their lives in war, may we also commit ourselves to Isaiah's vision. Each of us has the power to choose whether the tools in our hands — our words, our resources, our influence — will wound or heal. May we use them to wage peace, build understanding, and nurture life, so that future generations might truly inherit a world where swords have become ploughshares.

GEM OF AN EVENING WITH FRANCES CARLAW - 'THE PEARL LADY'



Allington WI members and visitors all enjoyed an interesting, illustrated, fascinating, intriguing, and humorous talk by Frances Carlaw, known as 'The Pearl Lady.' Her love of pearls began as a child, and her love and knowledge of the gems shone throughout her talk. Since then, her love of pearls has taken her all over the world doing talks to at least eight hundred Women's Institutes.

All the profits from the jewellery she sells, support some of the world's most impoverished children in South Africa, which helps to house, feed and educate them. It is a charity very close to Frances' heart.

She explained that there are three categories of pearls – natural pearls, found in the wild, cultured pearls grown in pearl farms, and faux or fake pearls. The latter are glass beads sprayed with pearlescence. Natural or wild pearls are very difficult to find on the vast ocean bed with one pearl for every 10,000



shells. Therefore, they have been treasured throughout the ages and are gems prized by royalty and the wealthy.

The La Peregrina pearl - a very rare 1" long teardrop, is one of the most famous in the world. In the past it was owned by the Spanish monarchy, before being bought by Richard Burton for the film star Elizabeth Taylor.

Frances told us the history of the most expensive set of pearls the world has ever seen, worth £10,136,299,418! (shown on the display in the first photo attached). This multimillion-pound collection started life in the 1500s as the Medici Pearls, but was later owned by Mary Queen of Scots and Elizabeth I and travelled around many Royal houses in Europe, until the remaining pearls now reside in the English Crown Jewels. The collection survived several beheadings, civil war, royal greed and intrigue! The story is fascinating, historical and encapsulates theft, mystery and murder. Only four pearls are left and are in the State Crown.

So next time you watch the Opening of Parliament, look and admire the four pearls on the King's Crown. Frances was excellent and hilarious in her storytelling.

Frances encouraged everyone to take care of their pearls and store them separately to prevent scratching and marks.

Frances brought with her a wide range of pearls and beautiful jewellery for everyone to buy, with all proceeds going to support her nominated children's charity. A wide range of natural and cultured pearls can be viewed on Frances' website: www.ThePearlLady.co.uk

Recycling of Empty Blister Packs





A book stall was also held where books, jigsaws and magazines were donated and sold for a nominal sum. A great way to re-cycle and recommend new books.



LONG BENNINGTON - PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council had its last Parish Council meeting on 6th October at St James's Hall.

New Councillor: Following the resignation of Mick Brooks, Councillors discussed the application from Andrew Taylor (being the sole application) and following a vote, it was resolved to approve his co-option to the Parish Council. Welcome Andy!

Thanks to Mick Brooks for his dedicated support for the Council and local community, particularly in connection with running the local Community Speed Watch initiative and as the main contact with the local Policing team.

Footpaths: The Parish Council has reported the verge on Church Street close to the bus stop. It has eroded with the drop now, in part of it, being close to a foot high and mud has blocked the nearby surface water drain. Lincolnshire CC have agreed to kerb across the front and graduate the verge to the kerb to make it safer and stop the overrun. It is expected this will be done at the same time as the planned reconstruction scheme on the footway starting in January 2026.

Playing Field: The Pavilion upgrade project completion had slipped slightly but is on budget and should be handed over on 10th October. Some minor external works are outstanding. Councillors discussed the offer of a grant from The Football Association, Greener Game Investment. The offer is for a maximum of £17,062.34 plus VAT to cover the cost of Solar Panel installation to the Pavilion roof. This was formally accepted by the PC as land owner. There are no financial implications for the Parish Council and this will be another local community building benefiting from greener energy (and hopefully lower bills!).

Defibrillator - Woods Close: The defibrillator at Woods Close is currently out of service following an issue with the combination lock on the external cabinet. Following some local maintenance efforts, it is now opening withous issue. However, was agreed that given the age of the defibrillator and the recommended lifespan, a replacement is to be purchased now. The approximate cost for the defibrillator and cabinet plus installation will be £2000. Provision in the budget next year is to provide for replacement of the defibrillator at the Police Office.

Following Parish Council meeting dates Monday 3rd November 2025 and 1st December 2025.
