

From the vicarage...

Harvest always reminds me why I "go to church". I think I've mentioned before, a life rhythm that includes gathering with others to give thanks is a weekly privilege that fills my soul with the song of gratitude. Harvest is a reminder of thankfulness for – food on our tables, neighbours around us, and the millions of ways God is generous to us.

This year you and I have something a bit less colourful than pumpkins and apples to be thankful for: the repairs to the wall in one of our church buildings in Long Bennington! Not glamorous, but vital. It means this useful and vital community building will still be here, safe and welcoming, for generations to come.







Tuesday, 2nd September Instead of holding a meeting in August our WI traditionally have a day trip and this year we visited Bletchley Park in Buckinghamshire, home to the Enigma machine and the most secret intelligence organisation of the second World War.

THE WOMEN

Bletchley is a regal looking house set in 58 acres alongside a beautiful lake. We saw it on a very hot day, but it could be a cold, bleak place to work in winter, with only coal fires to heat it and the surrounding huts. The codebreakers and personnel were recruited from all walks of life including top universities, and their work was so secret they were unable to even tell their families. Many only admitted their part decades after the end of the war.



Bletchley is a wonderful taste of recent history with the interiors kept as they were during the war and a reminder of how much we owe to those young men and women who helped shorten the war but never asked for or expected any recognition.

Also, in August members attended a lunch at The Duck in Woolthorpe which was held instead of our usual garden parties. It was a good chance for a catch-up over a delicious meal.



Our September meeting had us competing to dress the "Mother of the Bride", with remnants of material, tissue paper, scraps of ribbon and not a few safety pins and staples. Five models were chosen to dress up and the creative side of everyone came out. We even had instructions on how to make tissue paper flowers to add to the design. Our models all looked wonderful, but the winning team was "The Odies", who won hands down with a great outfit that included an amazing tissue paper hat that would have graced Ascot.

LONG BENNINGTON - PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council had its last Parish Council meeting on 1st September at St James's Hall.

Planning: Councillors discussed application S25/1395 Morris, for the erection of 1.5 storey dwelling at Vicarage Lane. Following lengthy debate around the satisfaction of previous objections and reasons for decline, Cllrs agreed, by majority, not to object but comment about retention of trees that provide noise mitigation for Lodge Close and request the provision of a footpath to join the existing one from Lodge Close. Cllrs were also referred to the condition of sanction for the Lodge Close development, to provide a footpath to join the existing footpath on Vicarage Lane. This hasn't been done so it was agreed to refer this to the Planning Dept/Enforcement Team.

Pavilion Upgrade Project: The work is progressing as expected with plumbing, new showers and new LED lighting being installed. The completion has slipped slightly with expected completion now 20th September. The second invoice for £13,342 has been presented and paid.

Witham Meadow





The above are before and after photos of Witham Meadow. The area had become too overgrown. Brambles had completely overtaken most of the central area and the grass was about three to four foot high in parts, choking many of the newly planted trees. Thanks to Geoff Fearn, who arranged the cutting of the area at no cost for the Parish Council, the area is now in a much better and safer condition for our visitors.

LOCAL GRANT APPLICATION SUCCESSES.

So far this year, Long Bennington groups/facilities have received grants totalling in excess of £68k (with a further £25k application pending from the SKDC Prosperity Fund), thanks to the hard work and persistence of some committed volunteers in our community. These funds really are vital to the continued availability of our fantastic local amenities. The list of grants are as follows:

£24073 from the Football Foundation towards the Pavilion Upgrade Project. £20000 from the National Lottery Community Fund towards the installation of solar panels at St James's Hall.

£5000 from BNA Charity towards the installation of solar panels at St James's Hall. £4500 from Bowls England for safety electrical work highlighted in the 5 year inspection at Long Bennington Bowls Club.


£5000 from Duchy of Lancaster (Church Patron) towards Long Bennington church structural repairs.
