From the Vicarage

Being British is something I cherish deeply. It's more than cups of tea, champion queuing, or the art of the profuse apology. At its best, it's a rich tapestry of history, resilience, generosity, and quiet strength. Reflecting back on last month's 80th anniversary of VE Day, we remember a moment when that resilience helped bring about peace in Europe—hard won, deeply felt, and never to be taken for granted.



Being British is also, unavoidably, to be shaped by Christianity. Our language, our laws, our care for neighbour, our heritage, our songs and our hopes—all bear its imprint.


To varying degrees, this is something we share with other cultures and nations. You can't really understand Italy without Christianity—or Nigeria, or Brazil, or the USA or myriad others. Every continent bears the marks of this Way of faith that has travelled, rooted, and blossomed.

That's part of what makes the recent appointment of the new Pope so compelling. An American citizen, naturalised Peruvian, multilingual, and now a global Christian witness. Pope Leo reflects something of the Kingdom of God: beautifully diverse, joyfully shared, and united not by sameness but by Christ.

Victory sits at the heart of Christianity—on a hill outside Jerusalem, where Jesus died and rose again. The battle truly is already won—not just for one nation, but for all humanity and creation. We live in the hope of that truth: beating swords into ploughshares, welcoming strangers as friends, and seeking peace that lasts.

80 years after Victory in Europe started the break out of peace, let's give thanks—for the courage of those before us, the gift of our own nation to us and all creation, and the joy of a Gospel that belongs to every land, every language, and every people.






BEAT THE SCAMMERS

I was recently reading an article about "Crash for Cash scams". In addition to causing car crashes so that they can make false car insurance claims, criminals are now trying to extort cash from their innocent victims at the scene of the crime. They try to cause an accident and then blame us for it. They might even set up situations where we believe we have hit the "victim" personally.

- Tip 1: Never ever agree whose fault it is. Do not engage into discussions with the "victim". If they are pushing or rushing us, or asking us for money, step back and call the police on 999
- · Tip 2: Gather as much as possible information. Take a video of the accident on your phone. Is there any dashcam or CCTV footage?
- Tip 3: Look for unrelated witnesses (not friends of the "victim" who are in on the case) and get their contact details.



Our speaker this evening was Dawn-Marie Lesh, accompanied by her two dogs Logan, a golden Lab sniffer dog, and Memphis Blaine, her Rottweiler protection and security dog.



Dawn was a police officer for 20 years but is now self-employed working in the private sector and is a security and firearms dog handler. Sniffer dogs are now regularly used at events alongside bouncers and are trained to detect the main drugs carried by users, those being cannabis, amphetamine, cocaine, heroin and crystal meth. Ketamine has been added lately.

Two of our members were given 100% synthetic drugs to conceal on their person and we all walked past Logan, but he sniffed them out and sat down in front of the "culprits". When Logan locates drugs, he is given his beloved toy to play with, which is the only reward he wants as that was how he was trained. Police dogs normally retire at 8 years old but as Dawn is self-employed, her dogs stay with her for life, even then they can no longer work.

Her Rottweiler, Memphis Blaine, is a protection and security dog and can chase suspects for long periods and will not give up until he succeeds in finding them. His is also riot trained. Dawn works country-wide with her dogs but has worked for many years in Bristol during Freshers Week until June in a huge venue, where up to 5,000 people can pass through the doors in just a few hours.

Dawn and her dogs were a delight, and she encouraged our questions during and after her informative talk. The dogs were a great hit with us all – a happier dog you could not wish to meet, especially when he receives his reward

Our next meeting, entitled Communicating through Body Language, will be held on June 3rd, where Nancy Appleyard will explain how we can tell what those around us might be thinking.

LONG BENNINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council had its Annual Parish Council meeting on 12th May at St James's Hall. Mark Newton and Geoff Fearn have both been voted back in to the roles of Chair and Vice-Chair.

The Parish Council meeting was preceded by the Annual Parish Meeting that was attended by approximately 30 members of the public, including some Parish Councillors and our newly elected County Councillor, Ken Bamford. There was a report from the Chairman of the Parish Council (available to view on the PC website), an introduction from CCL Bamford, a report from District Cllr Wood, a summary of the activities of Long Bennington Charities and a Q&A session. The main issues raise related to parking, footpaths and speeding in the village (responses/info covered below).

Parking

No waiting parking restrictions (traffic regulation order) – LCC highways are in the process of organising school parking and other surveys. Once done, initial proposals are to be sent direct to the Parish Council for comment ahead of a consultation process.

Footpaths

Footway site visits have taken place and assessments completed. Church Street is in the footway reconstruction programme for 2025/26, with a provisional start date of 22 January 2026. A design and location plan will be obtained from Highways nearer the time, when details are finalised.

Welbourne's Lane didn't quite score highly enough and it is expected this is to be reconstructed in 2-3 years based on its current score.

The Pastures / Bennington Close / Riverview - the footways on these streets are all in the 2025/26 programme for a micro asphalt resurfacing treatment, dates are to be confirmed.

Finance

Councillors approved sign-off of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return and this will be submitted to the external auditors.

The Parish Council approved a £1000 financial donation to St Swithun's PCC for churchyard maintenance and a £500 financial donation to St Swithun's PCC to support the Saxonwell News magazine production.

Playing Field Improvement Plans

It was confirmed the planned project to make improvements to the Pavilion is still waiting for the outcome of a Football Foundation grant application. This is critical to the viability of the project. The preferred contractor is available to do the work in June and if the project goes ahead, the facility will not be available while work is in progress. This will not impact the children's play area, tennis courts. MUGA or playing field.

Dear Friends,

Do people still surprise you? Or are you in a place where you feel like you've seen it all and nothing surprises you anymore?

I have been working with a group of people who about a month ago gave a clear indication that they were struggling with the idea of continuing the work they had been doing together. They are becoming fewer in number, older, less able to bring the energy they once could – and things seemed to be becoming overwhelming for them. We made a date to meet together again and continue just that one conversation.




When the time came to meet again, I reminded them where we had left off our discussion and asked them what they were thinking and feeling having had more time to think about it.

Now, I had pretty much expected them to say that they had reached the end of the road, the end of their resources, and it was time to move on somewhere else in a different direction. Instead, they began to talk about the purpose statement they had written a little while ago, and how that still reflected what they felt they ought to be doing. They compiled a list of nine options for the future and looked at each one in turn. In the process, they bypassed their original plan, rejected seven other options and ended up with a decision that felt right but surprised everyone. Only one person felt that they couldn't support the consensus at the end. Suddenly there seemed to be a new energy in the group, and I am hopeful that they will continue to work at their movement forward. But in reaching that point, they very much surprised me – in a good way.

I have also had the opposite experience, where people have reached conclusions and taken decisions that were not anticipated, which is sometimes not a pleasant surprise. But people do surprise you. Every church and every community is made up of people in all their variety. We do not all think or act the same or say the same things or even believe the same things. This can be a problem – if harmony can only be heard in the sameness. But as a musician, I know that the richness of a piece of music is to be found in the dissonance as well – the clash of notes, the unexpected progression of chords. What makes the difference is the resolution that can be found when the piece is complete, and harmony is restored.

We have all recently witnessed that process at work in the Conclave of Cardinals that elected Pope Leo XIV. Other candidates were voted for, and depending on the results, cardinals then had to choose an alternative nominee until one man emerged as the person who had the support of a sufficient majority of the electors. Their choice may have seemed surprising to many people, as was the choice of Pope Francis and of many of his predecessors. Each one takes their place and helps to guide the Roman Catholic people on their journey into the future. For some that guidance will be a pleasant surprise; the same decisions may disappoint or distress others. Our leaders can be just as surprising as we are ourselves.

It takes courage to be open to surprise, to approach the things that may disturb or frighten us with an curious attitude and a willingness to explore alternatives we may not have considered, or we may have rejected with due consideration. We are surprising creatures and we are designed to be lifelong learners in a world where so much can be discovered through experience, Let's not be afraid of the notes or the ideas that don't seem to fit with the patterns we have already learned. Let's be open to all the possibilities that life presents, trusting God to lead us forward in surprising ways.
