# From the Vicarage

A new year often brings thoughts of fresh starts. In Isaiah 43:19, God says, "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" This verse reminds us that God's work of renewal continues even in difficulty. Yet as we step into 2025, I want to take this opportunity to address a difficult part of the past head-on: the awful findings of the Makin Report.



Archbishop Welby will step down due to his and the Church of England's failure to address the abuse inflicted by John Smyth. Smyth's actions are particularly grievous because he contorted scripture to manipulate vulnerable young Christians. The cover of legitimacy he received from the Church of England places it at the centre of multiple collective failures.

It's right to feel sorrow, anger, and frustration over these events. As well as being disturbed by Smyth's abuses, I'm dismayed that others callously chose to cover up for the sake of institutional reputation over the lives of the traumatised victims. Jesus said, "Whatever you refused to do for the least of these, you refused to do for me" (Matthew 25:45). I think we should take these words very seriously.

We must not confuse the Church of England with God's Church eternal. The Church of England will only serve as a vehicle for God's love if it prioritises people. Thankfully, significant progress has been made to prevent abuse. Thousands of trained safeguarding officers, clergy, and volunteers ensure the safety of church environments across England.

If you or someone you know has experienced abuse, please don't stay silent. Speak out. Let us ensure that every voice is heard, every wound acknowledged, and every effort is made to safeguard others. Together, we can seek renewal that reflects God's call for love and justice.




#### **Christmas Market**





#### LONG BENNINGTON WI

7th January 2025 – Lincolnshire Police – Recognizing Fraud



It may have been a freezing night when we met up for our first meeting of 2025, but it was a hot topic that we were discussing. It turned out to be an extremely instructive talk from Sharon Hall, Fraud Protection Officer from Lincolnshire Police.

Five forces work together to form the East Midlands Special Operation Unit as fraud is a huge problem. 40% of all crime reported is fraud and there were 3.5 million instances in England and Wales in 2022/2023, however only 15% of fraud is reported!

The first ever recorded case of fraud was in 300 BC when a Greek merchant placed a wager on his ship not arriving in port and then he sank the vessel himself, so it has been going on for a very long time.

The main types of fraud are Postal, Telephone, Doorstep and Online. Sharon advised us to never reveal our personal information over the telephone and to shred our receipts as they have some of our card details printed on them. We should also be shredding our prescription labels as these contain our NHS number. We should not be answering calls from numbers we don't recognise as many are from automated numbers which will just cut off if they don't hear a voice. Anyone who is genuine will always leave a message. We should never disclose our security details and never assume the person on the line is genuine. Always check and never feel rushed into anything. 60,000 fraudulent telephone numbers have been disengaged due to the public reporting them. Sharon was an interesting and entertaining speaker and kindly took questions at the end and it appears that most of us have either been victims of fraud or know someone who has. She also handed out helpful leaflets to read and keep handy and we all agreed we felt more aware of what we should and should not be doing, either online or over the telephone.

# LONG BENNINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council had its last meeting on 6th January at St James's Hall.

**GENERAL UPKEEP** – some of our lovely grass verges are being damaged by regular parking. Avoid parking on the verges where possible. If the damage results in deep ruts this will make it impossible for these to be maintained by Steve when the grass cutting season starts in April.

**FLOODING** - the overnight flooding was discussed and an update on the proposed bund to protect properties on Church Street was provided. It was confirmed the scheme has been designed and accepted by LCC, the Internal Drainage Board and the Environment Agency. Given no Government/Authority funding is available, the scheme will be privately funded and completed in spring this year.

**PLANNING - S24/2214**. Derham. This application relates to 50 houses at the site next to The Pastures and the PC has been consulted. It will be discussed in detail at the February meeting and agreed comments subsequently submitted to SKDC.

**CURRENT DISCUSSIONS WITH LCC** – locally we still have three proposed projects being considered by LCC. These are number of local Traffic Regulation Orders to improve safety in the village, reconfiguration of the Valley Lane junction and a potential new pedestrian refuge around the Village Hall area of the village. These are in the early stages of consideration and may not proceed but these are being supported by the Parish Council.

**PARKING** – inconsiderate parking around the school at drop off and pick up continues to be a problem for residents living off Main Road. Please park at a legal distance from any junction to ensure safe exit by residents/drivers. The Parish Council has enlisted the support of the local Policing Team who will be monitoring the situation.

## **BEAT THE SCAMMERS**

Do you also get that feeling that we are not getting any younger? I certainly do even when I am only in my early sixties. Hence, I have put a few things in place to make sure that the right decisions are being made for me when I am not able to make these decisions myself. Again, this is an area where we see more activity by the scammers who know that we are becoming easier targets when we are most vulnerable and need help.

Tip 1: When the time is there that we can't take the right decisions for ourselves, would it not be great to already have a contingency in place. To set up Lasting Power of Attorney (<a href="www.gov.uk/power-of-attorney">www.gov.uk/power-of-attorney</a>) is something most of us can do ourselves, maybe with a little bit of help. You are NEVER too young for that. There are two types which we are likely to need:

- 1. Property and financial affairs This LPA covers our money and property.
- 2. Health and welfare This one covers our health care and personal welfare. Tip 2: And yes, when the final inevitable day is there, having a Will in place will make sure our money goes to the people we want it to go to and probably need it most. Not having a Will in place makes it much easier for the "Scammers" to get a share of it (and the Government too!).

#### LONG BENNINGTON METHODIST CHAPEL

Twenty-two years ago this month, I was present at the 25th Anniversary Celebration for a local church. It was a full occasion with lots of looking back that seemed always to end up in the future. Then a church with over 400 members, having had thousands of people passing through its doors, it had begun with 8 people in 1978, and it happened because the pastor and his wife were prepared to leave their home church to start a new one.

During the course of the evening, the question was asked, 'What if they hadn't come?' I guess the answer was that many lives would have been left untouched, unhealed, hopeless, friendless. How can we gauge the effect of prayers unsaid and work undone? If two people had not heard and answered God's call, the landscape of a whole town might have been quite different.



Over Christmas I found myself once again watching the film It's a Wonderful Life. Through a series of mishaps and missteps, bank manager George Bailey finds himself in trouble with the banking authorities and the law, and he goes on the run to avoid arrest. Finding himself on a bridge over a fast flowing river, he contemplates suicide, believing it would be better if had never been born.

Clarence, his guardian angel, gets involved and shows George what a different place his town would have been if he had not been there to help and support his neighbours, to care for his family and to be a source of kindness and good deeds for all sorts of people. He had promoted the common good and resisted those who were only intent on self-interest and evil.

Returning to his home and his own time, George has a completely different perspective on his situation, and when his grateful neighbours bring contributions to cover the money that had been lost from the bank's accounts, he is overwhelmed by their gratitude and appreciation, realising that while he had certainly given up almost all of his own dreams and ambitions, he had, indeed, had a wonderful life.

Perhaps we all wonder at times what our life has been worth and what difference our being here has made. Most of us live very ordinary lives and do not achieve extraordinary things, but that does not mean that we are not people of influence. Our words and actions make a difference to the people on their receiving end every day, and over time they shape the world we inhabit. If we speak and act with love, our influence will be positive and constructive.

Jesus taught us that living in love is the key to living a purposeful life. Living in the love of God and returning our love and loyalty to God brings us healing, hope and direction in life. Living with love for our neighbours near and far opens a world of relationships and connections into which we offer the loving strength God gives us. Such love is the power to change the world, one person at a time. Like the ripples on a lake when a stone is thrown into the water, the energy of an event moves on through time and across distances we cannot envision. We are all movers and shakers for good or ill.
