VICTORIA SPONGE CAKE: INGREDIENTS – 200g caster sugar, 200g softened butter, 4 eggs beaten, 200g self-raising flour, 1 tsp baking powder, 2tbsp milk. FILLING: Jam. METHOD: Oven temp 190° fan, 170° gas. Grease two 20cm sandwich tins and line with non-stick baking paper. Beat sugar, butter, eggs, flour, baking powder and milk in a large bowl. Divide mixture between two tins, smooth surface with back of a spoon or spatula.

Bake for 20 mins until golden and cake springs back when pressed. Spread the jam over one of the sponges and place the other on top. Dust with icing.

LINCOLNSHIRE FRUIT CAKE: INGREDIENTS – 12oz mixed dried fruit, 4oz demerara sugar, 1 large egg, 8oz self-raising flour, 7½ fl. oz cold tea. METHOD: Soak the fruit and sugar overnight in cold tea. Beat the egg and stir in the fruit. Add the flour and mix well. Bake for approx. 1 hour on 180° (170° fan) in a lined, greased loaf tin.

LONG BENNINGTON NEWS FROM THE PEWS

Those of us who love the Olympics recently witnessed the glory and joy of winners of medals, but also the tears of those who under-performed or came so close but then lost out to rivals.

Either way, Paris 2024 was riveting viewing for many. The Apostle Paul, who wrote much of the New Testament section of the Bible lived in the decades following the crucifixion of Jesus. In his texts, he often used analogies and illustrations from the society he lived in, particularly with reference to sport. For example, he refers to running a race (of life), of training with self-discipline, of running to win a prize, of fighting a good fight.

All these metaphors are to get across the qualities that a Christian should strive to acquire – living a life of purpose, discipline and commitment, but also of hope of glory. If Paul was writing today, I have no doubt he would be 'glued' to the Olympics, and he would have been inspired by the dedication of competitors who have sacrificed much and trained with total dedication over many years. He would get across that the competitors willingly do what is required in order to achieve their goal of Olympic success. In the same way, we should live our lives with that same level of commitment.

Paul would also highlight the difference between following Jesus and seeking the Olympic crown: "All athletes are disciplined in their training. They do it to win a prize that will fade away, but we do it for an eternal prize. So, I run with purpose in every step" 1 Corinthians 9 v25. The Good News of Jesus says that everyone who commits to a life with Him is guaranteed the Gold Medal: eternal life; and unlike the Olympics, everyone is invited to the Race of Life.



Many thanks to all of you - both individuals and local organisations (including the Parish Council, Co-op and Rotary Club) - who support our village church through your giving and donations. Thank-you also to those who sponsor or support our sociable fund-raising events – which we aim to make enjoyable for all attending. Many may not realise but these are the main ways we fund church mission, building repairs and all our running costs, including churchyard maintenance. BEAT THE SCAMMERS

Let's look this month at the requests from banks to provide a second level of security. When we make online payments, we are often being asked to confirm the payment by obtaining a code which is emailed/texted to us, or by going in the relevant bank app and confirm the payment.

If a scammer gets hold of our phone and payment cards, they can take, the generally unsecured SIM card, out of our phone and put it in theirs. The text message with the confirmation code is now send to their phone and the scammer can have fun spending our money.

• Tip 1: Please do not keep your mobile phone and credit/debit cards in the same place when out and about.

• Tip 2: Why we all are guilty of using the same password for many accounts, please make sure you use a unique and complex one for your payment cards and financial accounts.

The Parish Council had its last meeting on 5th August at St James's Hall.

WITHAM MEADOW – the Parish Council was informed of a concerning incident of a dog, in an adjacent garden, being attacked by a dog being walked off the lead and not under control in Witham Meadow. Sadly, the dog was not able to survive the awful injuries. Considering this, and to keep users of Witham Meadow safe, the Parish Council has made the decision to ask that dogs are always kept on the lead.

THEFT OF TRACTOR/MOWER – the insurance claim has been settled and replacement tractors are being considered. Improved security is being discussed and it has been agreed to keep a replacement tractor safely off site.

PLANNING – the Parish Council has highlighted to SKDC that one of the planning conditions, relating to the development near the Playing Field, has not been adhered to. The developer has not yet fulfilled a condition of sanction to install a pedestrian refuge close to Kirtons Lane. We understand this is now in hand and plans are being submitted to Lincs CC Highways along with the required fees.

Life may have many challenges for us in the coming year, as well as joys and successes. Whatever may come, let's be encouraged by John Wesley's experience, summed up in his statement, "Best of all, God is with us!"


